



Look at the differences in reaction of Joshua and Moses towards those who were prophesying outside their group. See the same difference in reaction of John and Jesus towards the one ministering outside their group. It is the kind of attitude displayed by Joshua and John that perpetuates poverty, hatred, and misery in today's world as well.

If religion has a bad name today and people walk away in disgust, it is because we have used religion to build walls and fences based on presumed differences, and not bridges and roads linking people together.

**Pontifical Requiem Mass for
Henry Damian Juncker,
First Bishop of Alton
(1809-1868)**

On **Tuesday, October 2, at 6:30 p.m.**, a pontifical requiem Mass will be offered at **SS. Peter and Paul, Alton**, for the repose of the soul of the first Bishop of Alton on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of his death.

Most Rev. Thomas John Paprocki will be the celebrant. Gregorian chant will be sung under the direction of Fr. Zach Edgar of Granite City.

Worship aids in Latin and English will be available. Bishop Juncker is buried underneath SS. Peter and Paul, and his tomb will be open after Mass.

Bishop Juncker was born in Lorraine and was ordained after he came to America. He was known as a dedicated pastor of souls.

SS. Peter and Paul is located at 717 State St., Alton. It was the cathedral of the Diocese of Alton until 1923, when the see was moved to Springfield.

BABY BOTTLE BOOMERANG IS COMING

In honor of Respect Life month, our parish will again be partnering with First Step Women's Center on their 4th annual Baby Bottle Boomerang campaign. First Step is an organization that ministers to mothers in our community facing an unintended pregnancy. Based on documented statistics, there are hundreds of mothers throughout our community making difficult pregnancy decisions.

Last year our parish contributions, along with others in the community, helped raise enough funds to meet their goals and ensure the operation of First Step's Mobile Medical Unit for the entire year. This fully equipped commercial van was an addition to their existing facility, and allowed their life saving medical services to be taken out into the community. This year's goal is to raise \$45,000 – enough to fund operating costs for the Mobile Medical Unit for one year along with the purchase of a New Ultrasound machine.

Our parish will be distributing baby bottles after each of the Masses on October 6th and October 7th. We encourage each family to take one bottle home and throughout the month of October fill it with currency or checks. Family, friends, co-workers or anyone who wishes to help can contribute to your bottle! Return the bottle at one of the Masses on Saturday, October 27th or Sunday, October 28th.

Supernatural love in marriage

Do you love someone who isn't loving you back? Have you experienced God's supernatural love helping you love those who are difficult to love?

For those of us who are married, we expect to be loved by our spouses as much as we need to be loved. And we assume that it's always going to be mutual: We will always be loved by our spouse with the same passion as we love them.

However, most marriages enter difficulties that require supernatural love as well as supernatural persistence. That's why we need the Sacrament of Matrimony instead of just a civil ceremony at the courthouse or beach. Marriages need divine grace to endure with the permanence that God provides.

In next Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus explains that the law of Moses permitted divorce (Deut. 24:1) because of the hardness of people's hearts. This is not an approval of divorce. He wants us to have hearts like his own, which never stops loving anyone.

In the days of Moses, when a marriage became difficult or unsatisfying, many men abandoned their wives. Although marriage was, from the beginning (Genesis Chapter 1) supposed to be a permanent covenant that united one man with one woman, a bill of divorce would allow an abandoned or rejected woman to remarry for her protection. It was never intended to be an approval of divorce.

Marriage is a reflection of God's faithful union with us. Permanence in marriage is a divine gift from God so that we can reflect him well. If we don't believe in the permanence of love within marriage, how can we believe that God is always in love with us -- including when we don't deserve it? And how can the children and others who watch us believe?

Remember, sometimes the lover goes to the Cross for the beloved. The vocation of marriage ordains the spouses to be a reflection of Christ's passion for all.

God never forces us to stay "married" to him. He loves us even when we turn away from him. Likewise, an unloved spouse is called by God to continue loving the one who abandons the marriage, even if only from afar. This is also true in any God-ordained friendships, and between priests and the laity they serve, and parents with their children.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

Have you ever quit a relationship because it was too hard? Did you really stop loving that person? How is the way you handled it like or unlike the heart of Christ?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How has God helped you love someone who quit loving you? How did you open yourself to receive his divine help? Describe how this reveals to others what God's love is really like.
