



From the Administrator's Desk.....!

Knowing their sinful act, Adam and Eve discover the dynamics of their shame: the sense of being less than. St. Paul, in his second letter to the Corinthians, reminds us of our heavenly dwelling perfect in every sense and lasting forever. Jesus declares kingship with all of us who do the will of God.

At the depth of our being, we human beings generally feel a sense of lack, inferiority, and shame. We think that everyone else seems more than us and our disordered desires drive us to violently appropriate others or expel them. The sin of Adam and Eve was a desperate move or an attempt to become like God. It was a pity on their part because that was exactly what God wanted to offer humanity - help discover His own image and likeness within us and grow into such image by doing God's Will and becoming brothers and sisters of Christ. It is a gift waiting to be received freely and gratefully; not to be grabbed in violent envy.

Brothers and sisters, we are neither less than or more than: we are simply the children of God.

Jesus, who is our path to salvation, calls us brother and sister and commands us to do the will of God. He comes to embody the love of the Father and set before us an example to follow. Indeed, in doing God's will, he shows us the way to the Father and calls us to do the same as we journey toward eternal life. Let us pray for the grace to discern and the ability to do God's Will in our lives.

Good News Reflection

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time June 17, 2018

God is calling you!

Next week, something is going to happen that will give you the opportunity to touch someone's life with God's love. Watch for it.

If you consciously choose to make the most of the situation, you might feel challenged, perhaps a bit nervous or intimidated, but you will experience the joy of making a difference for the kingdom of God. And you might be surprised at how well you do!

God has been preparing you for this situation for a long time. Your trials, your spiritual education, your personal purification process, your prayer-time insights, your Christ-centered conversations with others -- all these and more have been part of the preparation.

You are like the seed in next Sunday's Gospel passage. Life's circumstances have fertilized you, watered you, and tilled your soil. Over time, the seed sprouted, the plant grew, and the flowers began to produce good fruit.

Every day, we all encounter small and sometimes large opportunities to serve the kingdom of God. We don't have to be full-time volunteers nor paid employees of the Church to work in the mission of Christ. If we are willing, he touches the world through us in our homes, our workplaces, our parishes, in the grocery store, in the traffic tie-ups, on the Internet, and everywhere we go.

Have any of your seeds sprouted into a tree that withered from neglect or got chopped down by others? This happens to all of us. The good news is: In every dead tree at least one fruit remains, shriveled up and barely hanging from a lifeless branch, but secretly holding a very valuable seed.

We are to take those ugly, dead fruits and plant them in the freshly tilled soil of today. A new tree will grow and it will become taller and stronger and more abundantly fruitful than the tree from which it came, because the decay from the original tree is now additional fertilizer in the soil.

In everything that happens to you, remember: You have good fruits to share; God has been nurturing their growth. You *are* ready!

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What are some of the ways you have grown in your faith? How can this help others? Realizing that the good fruit that comes from your growth is Jesus working through you to make the world a better place, how do you feel about this?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

Describe various ways that we continue the mission of Christ in our ordinary lives. What produces new growth in us so that we become more useful to Christ?
